## Academic Supports and Assistance

## Available at MRMS

|  | At least once each week, your child's teachers (core academic, unified arts, special education, and interventionists) are available before and/or after school to reteach concepts, help with homework, provide coaching on projects, clarify expectations on assignments, etc. <br> In addition, MANY teachers volunteer to be available more than once a week - just have your child speak with his/her teachers to find out when and where they can come for extra help! |
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|  | Every morning in our school library, Mon-Fri, tutors and teachers are available to assist with homework, help with research, mentor long-term projects, etc. The library opens at 7:30 AM with a math tutor available from 7:30 to 8:35. At 7:45, additional tutors join in and are available until 8:15. At 8:15, students can head to the cafeteria for breakfast or remain for additional support. |
|  | Every afternoon in our school library, Mon-Thurs, an all-subject tutor with a MATH background is available to assist with homework, help with research, mentor long-term projects, etc. This support starts at 3:15 and ends with the departure of the late bus at 4:15. |
|  | Teachers have thirty minutes for lunch, but many voluntarily invite students to meet during lunch period so students can make up missed assignments, study for an upcoming test, review the day's lesson, accept responsibility for minor classroom misbehaviors, etc. This helps students who are engaged in clubs, sports, and other before-or-after-school commitments stay current with their work. Although there is no expectation that teachers give up their lunchtime to assist students, many choose to do so. Your child's teacher will invite your child when this an option. |
|  | Homework Help / Math Tutoring - head to room E119 after school every Monday to get help with homework, study for tests, etc. in a small-group setting. Ms. Schoenberg is the tutor. |
|  | Study Zone - head to room E119 after school every Wednesday - early release days, too - to get help with homework, study for tests, etc. in a one-on-one or small-group setting. Ms. Benoit is the tutor. |
|  | Every Monday and Thursday morning, members of the National Honor Society from Monomoy High School are available in the library to provide one-on-one assistance to MRMS students during AM tutoring sessions. They also travel to teacher's classrooms to support weekly extra help sessions and to help students study for upcoming tests, complete projects, and/or conduct research.
